

## Individual For Ten Players

With ten bridge players in an Individual Movement the identical situation holds true as in an Individual Movement for nine bridge players. Please review the movement for nine players.

The difference is that, in an Individual Movement for ten bridge players, two players will sit out each round, and this means that each player will miss two rounds of the Individual Movement.

Each player will necessarily miss having one other player as a partner, which means that a player playing eight rounds can have only eight partners, although there are nine other players. Therefore, only two of the players will be an opponent only one time.

The Individual Movement for Ten Players is shown below.
