BOSTON, Dec. 26.—Trade in wool on the Boston market was generally dull today, but there were a number of inquiries being received. Interest was still centered in the finer grades of territory wool, although recently a few buyers had been asking for quotations on medium fleeces. Some lots of strictly combing 56s, ¾ blood Ohio fleeces were being held at 29½ cents in the grease, but most of the recent sales were at 28 to 29 cents. Strictly combing 48s-50s ¾ blood did not move for a long time, and there was no established price on this grade, although most houses were quoting 27 to 28 cents in the grease.

Many of the hands illustrated in Mr. White's book were played during the exciting games at the home of City Atty. J. H. McBroom—a Monday night habit for 15 years. Mr. White has played at Mr. McBroom's regular games for the last eight years.
